We are proud to report that in 2013 the Jim Mora Count On Me Family Foundation awarded over \$75,000 in grant money and in-kind support to the community and logged over 640 hours assisting and volunteering at various events throughout our community.

Since our launch in 2005, the Foundation has expanded to three states and has given over \$750,000 in grants and in-kind support to our communities, and our staff, volunteers and supporters have participated in numerous children's outreaches, events and fundraisers, logging close to 3,300 hours for the community.

Foundation Grants

The Jim Mora Count on Me Family Foundation awarded \$115,000 in 2012 and 2013 to a total of 16 charities benefitting children in Atlanta, Washington, and California. In addition, over \$20,000 was donated to create Holiday Shops at five hospitals in those same states.

Funds for the 2012 and 2013 grant cycles were raised through the annual fundraiser – The Jim Mora Celebrity Golf Classic, as well as the Lucky Strike Bowling Benefit Bash, the BRO (Bruin Reporters Online) Campaign, the 50 for 50 Campaign in honor of Shannon Mora's 50th birthday, Count On Me Meet & Greets and through generous donations from individuals throughout the year.

The Foundation also collaborated with many of the recipients on in-kind donations and outreach programs. The Foundation awards grants and partners with charities and organizations whose mission aligns with ours: to support economically disadvantaged children, mentally and/or physically challenged children, medically fragile children as well as to support youth safety in sports and children at risk. The annual grant cycle for the Jim Mora Count On Me Family Foundation ends in fall. Grant recipients are announced by the end of the year.

Partnership with Special Olympics— **Young Athletes Program**

The Jim Mora Count On Me Family Foundation partners with Special Olympics to support the expansion of the Young Athletes program. This program is designed to inspire and motivate the youngest athletes, ages 2-7, with intellectual disabilities to participate in sports.

The Young Athletes program teaches basic sports skills through school assembly programs and leaves behind a sports bag of items to continue building upon the skills the athletes learn at the assembly that day. The program culminates in the spring with selected schools participating in the Young Athletes Count On Me Jamboree to showcase their new skills.

Late in the 2013 calendar, the Jim Mora Count On Me Family Foundation planted our "stakes" in the ground in California, announcing our charitable partnership with Special Olympics of Southern California. We look forward to a continued partnership with such an amazing organization.

The Count On Me Holiday Shop Program was created to empower children in hospitals in long-term care around the holiday season by allowing them to "shop" for their families, without ever having to leave the hospital. Young patients are able to select gifts from a wide range of creative options for their parents or guardians. For children unable to leave their rooms, they receive visits from volunteers with carts loaded with gifts so that they may participate as well. It is a well-received program and is thoroughly enjoyed by the children, their families, the hospital staff and our volunteers every single year!

As in previous years, the 2013 Count On Me volunteers assisted all of the children in wrapping their gifts with festive paper, bows, gift tags and writing cards for the special people in their lives. Board games were also a part of every child's shopping list so they could plan a fun game night with their siblings and other family members.

In 2013, Count On Me was honored to visit six hospitals in three different states with 67 big-hearted Foundation volunteers and serve 1,361 incredible young patients.

2013 Holiday Shops

Our 2013 Holiday Shop Program was an amazing success and touched the lives of over 1,300 children in three states.

The 2013 Holiday Shops started its tour at Mattel Children's Hospital UCLA on December 2nd. We were able to create a wonderful shopping experience for 84 children in long-term care. Our second stop was at Mary Bridge Children's Hospital in Seattle, where we were able to assist another 42 patients in long-term care.

Count On Me visited Atlanta, Georgia on December 9th and 10th. On the first day we set up shop at Children's Hospital of Atlanta-Egleston and had 174 children shop for their loved ones. The next day we gave 209 children their shopping experience at Children's Hospital of Atlanta-Scottish Rite.

Back in L.A, at Children's Hospital Los Angeles, we had 258 children in long-term care who shopped on December 16. At each of these Holiday Shops, parents enjoyed their own "special reception" of hot chocolate and treats while their children shopped for them; infants received soft baby blankets; and toddlers were treated to their own special goodie bags, ensuring every child in long-term care and their parent or guardian had a warm and cheery "shopping" day!

2013 Mother's Day Shop

On May 3rd, young patients at Seattle Children's Hospital enjoyed choosing a special gift for Mom at the Mother's Day Shop hosted by The Jim Mora Count on Me Family Foundation. The shop provided patients in long-term care the opportunity to "shop" for their mother or guardian without ever leaving the hospital. Count On Me volunteers walked each patient through the shop and helped them carefully select the right gift! Then the patients and their mother's are treated to a reception of goodies and refreshments! It was a great day for all those involved.
